Explore the Botanic Garden of the Jagiellonian University

In addition to herbivorous specimens, which can cleverly capture an arthropod for themselves, or even a vertebrate, you can admire ancient sagacious, which date back 280 million years ago to the Palaeozoic era. Kraków can proudly boast of 60 species, some of which still reproduce. The orchid collection of 500 species and varieties (dates to the 1860s) and valuable plants, such as tea, coffee and cocoa, are also worth seeing. The amazing orchid collection.

Poland's oldest botanical garden founded in 1783 comprise nearly ten hectares of green and flowery loveliness. Besides the fresh air and beautiful blooms, here you can find herbivorous specimens, a date palm and a Jagiellonian oak tree around 220 years old. It is a place for walks for Kraków citizens and tourists and an educational and research centre where you can admire the rich world of plants from all over the world.



During our walk you'll get the chance to eat a meal at one of so called Milk Bars. Generations of Polish people would eat their dinners at places like that. Affordable home-cooked meals attract especially students, who can, even for a moment, feel like they're at home despite being on the other side of the country.

Manggha Museum of Japanese Art and Technology

Fans of Japanese culture will be delighted in Museum of Japanese Art and Technology 'Manggha'. It is an extraordinary place where the mutual cultural relations between Poland and Japan, the East and the West, are being shown.

The intriguing world of distant Japanese culture is a permanent element of Kraków's cultural landscape - The wave-shaped building of the Manghha Museum on the bank of the Wisla river just opposite the Wawel Hill was designed by Arata Isozaki, Japan's prominent architect. Despite its modern feel, the building's style draws on traditional Japanese architecture.

The main part is the magnificent collection of Japanese art presented to the museum by an eminent collector, Feliks Jasieński, in 1920. The name of the museum - Manghha - comes from the nickname taken by the collector. Beautiful objects: woodcuts, objects of artistic craft including ceramics, costumes, fabrics, and weapons provide the starting point for regular presentations of various subjects connected with Japanese art, culture, and customs.



Schindler's Factory - journey through lives under occupation

It is definitely a must-see place to understand the situation in Poland during World War II. The former Oskar Schindler's Enamel Factory nowadays houses an exhibition entitled "Kraków under Nazi Occupation 1939-1945", which is one of the most interesting and important exhibitions worth visiting in Krakow.

The museum is built in a unique way: each room is precisely arranged to resemble a very specific place – a street, a hairdresser's salon, a labor camp, a railway station and many more. It is like a history lesson that you can simply walk into!



The tour will begin from the barbican. It is one of the greatest examples of medieval military architecture in Europe. During the tour you will be able to learn more about the history, culture and topography of the city of Krakow. We will pass by the most significant places in the city's history. Our trip will end in Kazimierz, which is one of the centers of the city's cultural life. For many centuries, Kazimierz was a place where Jewish and Christian cultures coexisted and intertwined.


MOCAK Museum

In art we trust! The exibition in one of the greatest and most famous museum in our beautiful city encompasses presentation of the latest international art, education as well as research and publication projects. MOCAK has two important tasks - first to present the contemporary art of the two last decades in the context of the post-war avant-garde and second to highlight the cognitive and ethical value of art and its relationship with everyday reality.



The Main Building features the newly renovated upper Gallery of the Twentieth Century Polish Art, one of the largest galleries of painting and sculpture from the late 19th century on in Poland, works by artists of the interwar and postwar periods: the Polish cubists, expressionists, colorists, the avant-garde of the 1930s, and representatives of New Directions from the 1960s. Moreover, there is a permanent Gallery of Decorative Arts, and Gallery 'Arms and Uniforms'.

The National Museum in Krakow - Main Building



"The past to the future" was the motto of the founder of Czartoryski Museum - Izabela, who wanted to preserve Polish heritage. Here we're able to admire recovered treasures from Wawel Cathedral, the Royal Castle and other object donated by Polish nobel families. But besides that, there's also one of Leonrado da Vinci's best known works, the Lady with an Ermine. Other highlights include works of Rembrant, several antiquities or Renaissance tapestries.
